#### Relationships

The very foundation of the gospel news is that God entered the world through Jesus Christ in order to be in relationship with us. Being in relationship with us is important to God. We value what it means to know our Lord and have our Lord know us. And building on that relationship through worship, prayer, devotion, and serving is so helpful and good for us. May this summer provide a beautiful change of season when your relationship with your triune God may blossom and grow.

We know from scripture that we are also created to be in relationship with others. It is difficult to live in isolation and most of us have a variety of connections with people who are important for us – family, neighbors, friends, coworkers, other organizations and within the church. I hope that you might take a few moments to give thanks in prayer for those relationships that you most value. Go ahead and pause for a few minutes right now...... But don't stop in the thanking – make some plans or connections so that this summer will be a time of developing some beautiful new relationships and building on those old ones; with phone calls, meals, visits, special outings, and shared activities.

I think about a variety of ways the life around here at Our Redeemer continues to create and foster space for building relationships. We will be moving to our summer worship schedule of 9:30am worship followed by fellowship, from May 29 - September 4. Help this to be a summer of getting to know a few more in your church family and building the friendship you already have here. We are offering again this summer a weekday evening worship opportunity for those with schedule conflicts or just looking for something different – 6:00pm worship in the Fellowship Hall with some game options at 5:30 and a treat following worship. On the Last Wednesday of each month we are joining with a group of Maplewood area churches who will be worshipping at Bruentrup Heritage Farm 2170 County Road D East, Maplewood (just east of Maplewood Mall) – dinner and activities at 5:30 if you want, and worship at 6:30.

We are building relationships with people beyond our walls this summer too. We have welcomed another group of immigrants from Bhutan and Nepal who are filling our back gardens with vegetables (see inside for a picture and some more news) and soon will begin a summer meal program to serve a number of folks in the community (see more news inside about this 'Sunny' program). Both of these avenues of outreach have a relational base to them as we seek to get to know these folks better.

Relationships are important, valuable, life giving and just plain good for us. Work on your relationships this summer - I will certainly be doing this as well.

When was the last time you had to worry about where your next meal would come from? Have you ever skipped a meal so that there would be enough food to feed your children? Do you know someone personally who has been faced with the difficult decision of whether or not to pay their rent late so that they can simply go to the grocery store? The reality is that food needs in our surrounding community are indeed great, especially during the summer months when children are out of school and more of the food demands fall on financially -stressed families.

This summer ORLC is excited to partner with Loaves & Fishes in launching S.U.N.N.Y (Serving Up Nutrition Now to Youth) to provide a nutritional hot-lunch meal twice a week on Tuesdays & Thursdays in Fellowship Hall starting June 9<sup>th</sup> from 11:30 am – 12:30 pm. Children, youth and individuals are welcome following the meal to pack a nutritional cold bag lunch to take home. S.U.N.N.Y meals will run through the summer until Tuesday August 30.

Partnerships are important and make for great ministry as the Spirit guides us in reaching out to our community! It is our hope the community members (city, police, fire department) and local restaurant establishments will help serve and contribute to helping feed children in our neighborhood. Even our very own ORLC community gardeners will be contributing some fresh produce for our meals! This summer is an exciting time to be church together and I hope you share in the excitement!

We are also partnering with Frost Lake Elementary administration and staff in intentionally extending an invitation to the children and families of Frost Lake Elementary which is right in our backyard. We encourage members of ORLC to come participate not only in volunteering this summer – but in participating in eating a meal with the community! Meals are better enjoyed when people are gathered together and research has shown that overall health improves when people eat a meal with others. So come this summer to not only help feed others – but to be fed nutritionally and spiritually by caring for our neighbors as the community of Christ! To help: hold the ministry in prayer, come eat at S.U.N.N. Y, sign-up for a shift (10.30 am - 12)pm and/or 12 pm - 1:30 pm) on the S.U.N.N.Y bulletin board, donate food items needed and consider joining the leadership team by contacting me! Thrivent Member? We could use Thrivent Choice Dollars to purchase milk and meal supplies for the summer! Please prayerfully consider supporting this outreach and ministry in at least one of the numerous avenues.

Thank you to all who stopped in to have their pictures taken or who delivered photos to be included. We are in the process of putting together the inside pages of photos (send some to the church if you have good ones) and visiting some homebound folks who could not make it here. We plan to get these new directories in the fall. If you did not get your picture taken it is not too late to turn in a photo of your choice from home. We really are trying to get as many photos of people as these directories are helpful for learning names and making contact. Also we hope you plan to join us for worship on Sunday, June 5<sup>th</sup> as we will take a congregational photo out in our front yard after worship – about 10:30am.

**Vegetable Gardens** – Once again we are partnering with Hmong American Partnership (HAP) to provide space for various immigrants they work with to have space for growing food. This year again the 13 10x4 plots we have on the south side of our building are being used by a number of folks from Bhutan and a few others from Nepal. What a joy it was to work alongside of them in May to prepare the gardens. These are folks used to farming when they were back home but have limited space and area to grow food. We had a great day on May 14 of cleaning out the beds and getting them planted. Here is a picture of most of the group along with some ORLC helpers.

We are also adding three more vegetable gardens plots so that Our Redeemer growers will now be tending to 8 beds and donating the produce weekly to the food shelf - we anticipate this will be more than 500 pounds! Two of our new growers are African women and a few of our youth are taking responsibility for a plot. What a great way to do good work, build some relationships, and care for our community.

Keep an eye out for the opportunity to buy into a CSA (Community Service Agriculture) program being developed at Our Redeemer along with HAP that will bring bags of fresh produce directly to the church for those who want to buy into receiving a share. More details about participating will come out next month.



#### **Synod Gathering Update**

The annual ELCA St. Paul Synod meeting was held May 20-21 2016. Pastor Karsten, Rita During and Cathryn Heimerdinger attended the events as representatives of Our Redeemer. It was a faithful time of worship, decision making and education of further opportunities available for the church, as well as an opportunity to connect and network with other parishioners in our synod. We heard wonderful Keynote addresses about what it is to be bold and hopeful Lutherans. We heard from the two main partner ministries of the synod, Iglesia Luterana Agustina de Guatemala (ILAG) and Bega Kwa Bega. ILAG is a Lutheran ministry in Guatemala that is helping to develop local pastors and ministry leaders. They also provide support for women's ministry and skill development, children's education and youth ministry, and clean water for the people in their communities. Bega Kwa Bega is a Lutheran ministry in Tanzania who partnering congregations provide clean water and ministry support to the people in that country. We also passed resolutions dealing with gun violence, building Christian-Muslim relations, and addressing the 'Doctrine of Discovery' and its harmful effects on the Native nations in this country.



The Church Board and our Worship and Music Team have been in conversation for a number of months exploring the language of invitation we share (both written in the bulletin and spoken during Communion) regarding who is welcome at Holy Communion. There are conversations happening in many congregations, including Our Redeemer, about seeking to ensure there is a deep welcome for those who come to worship to join us for Communion. Through a questionnaire we had at our May 15<sup>th</sup> worship services we found response supportive of this overall direction, some with concerns related to serving people of no faith or being non-Christian, and a few comments with suggestions related to order and flow. We will continue to be engaged in dialogue as leaders and will be trying out a few options for our intentional welcome to Communion during these next months. We will share more about this at our Semi Annual meeting on June 26 and will use the newsletter in future months to keep sharing more news and information.



#### **Knitting & Crocheting**

God's Hands Knitting & Crocheting meets on the third Thursday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00. We have adopted Caribou Coffee on White Bear Avenue and County Road D, (by Maplewood Mall), as our current gathering place. Most of the work is done elsewhere but it is great fun to see the current projects. We share patterns, ideas and sometimes, we share yarn. Nine Prayer Shawls were given last year, as needs were made known. We recently completed a service project with Jack's Basket by donating 10 pairs of baby booties and 23 infant hats for newborns. Besides the donated items, we work on various personal projects. We bring our works "in progress" and enjoy good conversation. Please consider joining us on June 16, July 21, August 18 and September 15.
