

A Message from Pastor Karsten:

### Choose your paths

There are a couple of deer who have learned that coming through my backyard gives them a good path into the neighborhood, and so during the winter I can see their walking steps in the snow. Once this winter I actually saw one of them crossing the yard. They repeatedly take this same path in the winter and in the summer to visit and take some tomatoes (ugh). They have learned a path that is helpful and fruitful (literally).

We have the season of Lent upon us and this is a great time to be intentional about some new or old paths that we travel in our walk of faith. Lent has traditionally been a time when people take on various disciplines/paths to live into sacrifice, to try new pathways for their spiritual life, and to open themselves up to God’s good work in them and touch through them.

One path we are encouraging people to travel again this Lent is to consider a spiritual discipline (or two). At the Sunday forum February 9, we talked about how disciplines matter and also about some different pathways we would like to suggest you might try: reading through scripture (Mark or Colossians, or the New Testament), more time for devotions and prayer, abstaining from some food (and giving the saved money to charity), times for deeper personal reflection and repentance, being still, or tending to works of love/service. Please consider something that can be good for you, for your faith, and for the world, and travel that path from now until Easter, on April 12.

Three special opportunities are going to be happening at Our Redeemer which you are encouraged to consider. With our theme of “What are you Hungry for?,” we invite you to come to the weekly Sunday morning study group that will meet between services in the Blue Room off the Fellowship Hall. There is a weekly reading for the discussion along with a calendar of daily thoughts, scripture or ideas related to the issue of world hunger.

You can partake in the special offering challenge from the Missions Team to participate in the discipline of giving \$2 a day for hunger relief. Members will get a label (40 Days of Giving) to put on an envelope or can or jar at home, and then we ask that you to bring those back during Holy Week with all proceeds going to ELCA World Hunger Appeal (with 100% being used for direct aid).

The other congregational opportunity is to join together on Wednesday nights at 6:30 for worship. We will have a short 30-minute service that will include music, prayer and a reflection message from various members to address, “What are you hungry for?” as they speak about something that is motivating or challenging them, and share why that is important and what they are doing about it. Come join us for these good evenings of worship. We will be serving our Wednesday evening Loaves and Fishes free dinner so you are welcome to eat between 5:30—6:30 p.m.

*Get ready to travel a good path this Lent.*



## A Message from Deacon Jennifer Schneider: The Outsider and the Giraffe

Occasionally, I have a Sunday off from ORLC. I know you think I am playing hooky! I am sure you are thinking I lounge around in my fuzzy pajamas reading the paper on those days. Nope!

Believe it or not, I like to pretend I am a secret shopper! I visit other churches - to experience other styles of worship, look for other ways people are “doing” or “being” church, and generally gain perspective on what it feels like to be an outsider. It helps me think about ways we as a congregation can be more attuned to the experience a visitor has at ORLC.



I have recently visited 2 churches in Minneapolis. When I arrived at Church A, there was no where to park and I couldn't find the main entrance of the church. Awkward! When I did find my way to the sanctuary, (5 minutes into worship), there wasn't an open spot to be found - well maybe right in the front. The end of each pew was capped off by 1-2 people. There simply wasn't a good way to get into the middle part of each pew where there was actually seating.

At Church B, there was plenty of parking, but when I walked into the sprawling gathering space, I had no idea which way to go. Hundreds of people were chit-chatting with each other over coffee and event registration tables, but no one noticed me, the visitor who was obviously lost.

At both churches, there was uplifting music, contemplative liturgy, and thought-provoking preaching. There were tasty donuts and fresh coffee, registration tables with lots of activities, and lots of people milling about. But, at neither church was I welcomed or engaged in conversation by members or staff. In fact, I doubt anyone noticed me. Being an outsider really sucked. I felt lost. In a sea of Christians worshipping the same God, I felt lonely and isolated.

How do we at ORLC do welcome? How do we respond when a visitor comes through the door? Do you remember the name of the last visitor you met? Did you engage them in conversation or make room for them in your pew? Did you tell them about Wednesday night dinners or invite them to participate in a service project?

Being on the outside is tough. When you go to a new place, you are already sticking your neck out of your comfort zone. As Christians and members of a faith community, it is our job to invite, welcome, and make people feel at home in God's house. As the giraffe mascot at my daughters' school says, “Stick your neck out.” In welcoming a visitor, you might be the encouragement a person needed to join the church, you might make a new friend, and you might be the only glimpse of Jesus that person may experience. In any of these, you are living out our call to love our neighbor. Now go stick your neck out!



## Quilting—We're Back!

Our Quilting group's "winter hiatus" is almost over, and we're looking forward to another great season of quilting at ORLC! This long-established service group meets on the **second and fourth Mondays** of the month in the Fellowship Hall from **9:30 to 11:30 a.m.** We tie yarn to quilt tops where the only skills needed are the abilities to hold a needle and stitch a knot. This readies the quilt tops for hemming. The cutting of the fabric squares, piecing and sewing of the squares is done by some of the members in their homes. You don't need to bring any supplies as we have enough to share. When we wrap up at the end of each session, we share in enjoying refreshments and conversation.



Most of the yarn and fabric for the quilts are donated. The backing sheets, thread and batting are purchased. In some years, we have had a raffle to raise funds for these purchases. We have also received funds from the *Thrivent Action Team* to support this service opportunity. Some of the 2019 recipients were *Alley Shoppe 109*, *Project Home*, recent baptisms & graduations along with donations for *National Night Out* and *ORLC's Twelfth Annual Fine Arts & Craft Sale*.

## A New School Year Under a New Roof

Thanks to all who contributed to the BKB 'Raise the Roof' campaign, students at Mtera Secondary School will begin the 2020 school year in a brand new multi-purpose building, with a brand new roof. Together with the Iringa Diocese, the Scholarship and Education Working Group of the Iringa Committee determined that we would work together to complete the roof for the building at Mtera Secondary School before the rainy season, which began in November. With help from 15 congregations (Our Redeemer was one of these - this was where our Lent offerings went last year) in the Saint Paul Area Synod and several individuals, the roof was completed in November at a cost of \$26,000. This project was so important because Mtera is one of the schools situated farthest from Iringa Town. Mtera, which is also the location of a major hydroelectric dam, is 77 miles north of Iringa.



## A note of "Thanks" to ORLC

Precious New Year greetings to you and all at ORLC. We trust that you are all doing fine. We're excited about what the Lord is doing in the lives of the people whom He has called us to reach. Be blessed with the following good report from the work of the ministry in Sierra Leone, West Africa.

### THE ABOP PRAYER REVIVALS

These prayer revivals create a platform for people to come and have a personal encounter with Lord and the people always come with expectant hearts because they are always blessed when we have these gatherings. During these revival meetings the power of God is always present to heal the sick, deliver the demon possessed and set the captives free. In the months of October and November 2019, we ministered to over 1,200 people.



### THE BIBLE SCHOOLS

In the Bible Schools we teach, train and disciple our students to discover their destiny in order to fulfill the plan of God for their lives. We have 165 students who are very much excited about what the Lord is doing in their lives and the transformation which they have experienced since they started attending the Bible School in September 2019. Here is a student testimony:

*Coming to the bible school restored hope in my life. As a result of the teachings which I have received in the Bible School I have traveled on mission trips to preach the word which I have never done before. Thanks to the bible school!*



### PASTOR'S EMPOWERMENT CONFERENCES

The pastor's and leaders empowerment conferences was well attended in October and November 2019, with a total attendance of 250 pastors and leaders who came from different churches. 75% of these pastors and leaders are graduates of the bible schools. Donald ministered the word and these leaders were very grateful for the opportunity to have such a conference that helps to refill them with the word of God. Several of them testified with gratitude about the huge impact which these conferences are making in their lives and ministry.

We want to express our sincere gratitude to you and all at ORLC for your continual financial support which is helping us extensively to teach and preach the word of God in Nations. Thank you for your partnership which we cherish very much! We cease not to give thanks to the Father for you always!
