A Message from Pastor Karsten:

It's Easter and time for some resurrection life – as well as reconnecting and reengaging

Easter is here, the journey of Lent is behind us, and it is time to celebrate the grand story of God's fullest work in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. After 40 days with the disciplines of Lent, and almost a year since we have been able to plan regularly for in-person, indoor worship, that time has come.

Join us for **Easter Worship on April 4 in person at 6:45 a.m.** (Sunrise Service - a long observed Easter tradition), **8:45 a.m.** or **10:00 a.m.**, or online live for the 10:00 a.m. worship (this will also be recorded for later viewing access). There will be flowers, there will be grand music, there will be streamers and banners, there will be good preaching, and there will be people to celebrate together and enjoy Holy Communion. All who come will need to wear masks (even if you have received the vaccination), stay socially distanced in the sanctuary (every other pew and six feet away from others), sing softly, and enjoy fellowship time with coffee and treats under some new guidelines (see page 3).

We are planning to continue in-person worship every Sunday at 10:00 a.m. throughout spring, while also providing this live on *YouTube* viewing at 10:00 a.m. and recording the service for later viewing. When the weather gets warmer, we will also plan a number of services to be held outside as we heard from many that there is a was strong interest as was done last fall.

Besides this chance to return to some sense of normalcy of what we were used to before all the complications and restrictions COVID-19 brought, we will be focusing on two key words this spring and summer. This will be time to **Reconnect** and **Reengage**. We look forward to seeing people face to face and trying to recall the names we may have forgotten, but we are also planning for guided conversation times on Sundays and during the week to really listen to each other's stories from this past year (and beyond) so we are more deeply tied together. We will also be encouraging people to consider one place of ministry engagement when you come back – serving on a team, helping with worship, working with our youth, assisting the Missions team, volunteering on Wednesdays, or participating in a smaller group setting. We are looking to have people present in the church, in our everyday life, and assisting with the work of the church. So know that those two words will get lots of play and even some push in the months ahead because we want to come back and be stronger as a church than we were before.

We mark Thursday, April 22 as **Earth Day** and Friday, April 30 as **Arbor Day**. First celebrated in 1970, Earth Day now includes events coordinated globally by the Earth Day Network in more than 193 countries. Arbor Day began in Nebraska in 1874 and today is celebrated in all 50 United States.

While most holidays celebrate something that has already happened and is worth remembering, Arbor Day [and Earth Day] represents a hope for the future. The simple act of planting a tree represents a belief that the tree will grow to provide us with clean air and water, cooling shade, habitat for wildlife, healthier communities, and endless natural beauty — all for a better tomorrow.

These are not faith-based holidays, however our faith guides us in how we honor the earth and all creation. As Christians we have a duty and responsibility to care for all of God's creation. Recently, our congregation has adopted increased efforts to **RECYCLE**. We have a larger dumpster to accommodate cardboard from our Community Sharing meal. We also have a receptacle in the Fellowship Hall to save plastic film (think grocery bags, bread bags, saran wrap, and bubble wrap). ORLC also is now implementing **ORGANICS** collection, which helps cut down on the amount of garbage that ends up in the landfill. We also give our leftover outdated food items from Wednesday nights to a **PIG FARMER!**

There are some easy steps you can do to care for creation! When you are at ORLC, please bring your own **WATER BOTTLE** that can be refilled in our drinking fountain, which will cut down on disposable plastic bottles. When you wash your hands, put your paper towels in the **GREEN ORGANICS** bins, which are located in each bathroom and the kitchen. If you are eating at church, be sure to put the food scraps - including popsicle sticks, toothpicks, napkins, bones, and coffee filters in the **GREEN ORGANICS** bins and your plastic bags/wraps in the gray bin marked for plastic film.

Other easy ways you can care for God's beautiful creation: pick up litter in your neighborhood, use less fertilizer and pesticide on your lawn, add native plants and **pollinator-friendly flowers** to your landscape (butterfly bush, coneflowers, daisies, dahlias), cut down on the use of single-serve portions, and **refrain** from using Styrofoam.

Updated COVID Guidelines for Opening our Church

To comply with the most recent March 2021 restrictions from Minnesota and the Center for Disease Control, we are obligated to follow these guidelines in order to open our doors (even if vaccinated): wearing of masks; social distancing of 6 feet between people from different households/groups; no beverages or food in the Sanctuary except for our Holy Communion serving; beverages and food will be allowed in the Fellowship Hall with the following restrictions: must adhere to the 6 feet social distancing, must remain seated, may remove mask only for eating and drinking, communal serving and sharing of food is discouraged. Cleaning and disinfecting according to the *SMART Team* guidelines will be followed. Anyone not feeling well or not comfortable attending in-person services and gatherings are encouraged to stay home. Please contact the staff if you have any questions. NOTE: On Easter, the ORLC Staff will be assisting in the serving of our new way of "Coffee Hour" but please feel welcome to volunteer to help them. We will resume our volunteering schedule the remaining Sundays taking into consideration that some past volunteers will not be interested to do so or may be unable to attend.

As one of the key ways right now we can care for ourselves and love our neighbors by becoming less risk of spreading this virus, we encourage you to get your vaccine. Also, if you are comfortable with letting us know if you have been vaccinated, please contact the office. We will use the information only to determine what percent of our congregation has been vaccinated without sharing names of individuals.

Coming Soon—a shared Intern

Our Redeemer, in collaboration with three other East Side Lutheran Churches (Hope, Grace and Arlington Hills) has been chosen as a site for a shared intern this coming year. Starting in late August, we will be excited to welcome this kind of engagement again as we come alongside a student, provide support/encouragement/opportunities, and work with these other churches to send another strong candidate into a deeper life of ministry. Our Redeemer will benefit from this shared ministry and details are still getting worked out for how this person will function in this wider context so that they are not stretched too far, but have ample opportunities for their own growth. We find out the placements for all interns on April 8 and will share more with you in the weeks and months to come. Food shelf Assistance

As we continue to have a strong partnership with Merrick Community Service and North Saint Paul Food shelf, and as we continue to expand how we are helping individuals and families on Wednesday nights, we become more aware of the diversity around us and the hope for food support. As you consider some extra support, you can always give a financial gift marked 'food shelf' but if you would like to buy some food to donate, consider picking up more items requested by various immigrants – maybe have some fun searching out these new foods such as: tamari soy sauce, fish sauce, coconut milk, almond butter, garlic chili sauce, tamarind paste, Jasmine rice, Kokuhu rice, fufu flour. One issue ahead that we believe will cause more people to be using the food shelves and our Wednesday Community Sharing is when there will likely be more renter evictions taking place—and this is one area we are working on with advocacy.

Here other petitions may be offered for yourself, family, Our Redeemer, Christian churches elsewhere, strong leaders worldwide, justice....


Incline your ear to our prayers and fill us with power to live out our faith, by the power of your Son our savior, Jesus Christ.

Scripture Reflections and Questions

Jesus could have returned with armies of angels, dazzling bright light (it wouldn't have been the first time), trumpets and choirs filling the sky. He could have conquered the world in a grand display of power and show. Instead, Jesus showed up in the most mundane of tasks—a meal. How often we look for Jesus in grand spectacles. We seek large gestures of miraculous power. But Jesus doesn't only show in those transfiguration moments. Jesus wakes us up as we eat, as we walk, as we talk. Jesus becomes known as we share with one another, as we celebrate being in community. Sometimes we don't realize it until later. Sometimes we are blessed to recognize Jesus in the moment. Jesus is always there. We only need the eyes to see. Where might you see Jesus in unexpected ways?
